
MDI CONNECT PROJECT SPOTLIGHT:

COOK COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER'S OFFICE (ILLINOIS)

The Cook County Medical Examiner's Office (CCMEO) in Illinois was established in 1976, and the medical examiner is appointed by the president of the board of county commissioners. Cook County is the only county in Illinois with a medical examiner; all other Illinois counties utilize the coroner system. CCMEO serves a population of approximately 5.3 million residents which is roughly 45% of the state's population. The office investigated 20,080 deaths in 2022 and completed 4,088 autopsies.

The MDI office is populating their CMS with the postmortem toxicology results directly from the Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS)



Dataflow Project Description

Toxicology and MDI Case Management System (CMS)

Cook County Medical Examiner's Office (CCMEO) is upgrading their current data-sharing capabilities between their laboratory information management system, LabLynx, and the outsource toxicology laboratory, NMS Labs. This upgrade allows CCMEO to acquire additional toxicology testing data quicker on drug use. The additional data plus the current drug death data will lead to faster case closure and improved resolution for families.
