


# Violence is a Public Health Issue Promotion Kit

Violence is a public health issue and spreads similarly to other diseases. Like other public health issues, education and prevention are strong interventions in stopping the spread. The Weaving a Violence Prevention Ecosystem (WEAVE) Team, a partnership between <u>Health Resources in Action</u> and <u>CDC Foundation</u>, developed resources to supplement the <u>WEAVE Toolkit</u> and help build your community capacity for addressing community violence as a public health issue.

*Did you know?* Violence impacts not just individuals but entire communities, spreading trauma, straining our healthcare system and undermining public health efforts. It's time to recognize violence as a critical public health issue that demands our attention and action.

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#### Why it matters:

- 1. *Physical and mental health:* Survivors of violence, and those exposed to high levels of violence in their communities, often face long-term health problems, from chronic pain to PTSD.
- 2. *Healthcare costs:* Treating violence-related injuries drains resources from other essential health services.
- 3. *Community well-being:* Communities of color experience more violence. High violence rates erode trust and cohesion, perpetuate cycles of trauma and exacerbate existing health disparities and inequities.

*We can prevent violence.* Together we can build violence prevention ecosystems that create safe and strong communities. You have the power to engage and uplift the voices of residents in your community.
